Overview of ROC and Annual Goals

The NNLM *All of Us* Training and Education Center (TEC) has two main areas of focus: 1) to support engagement and awareness of the *All of Us* Research Program within public libraries, and 2) to support, create and maintain the Program's training and education needs via the creation of learning events and deliverables tailored to a wide variety of stakeholders and audiences along with an online learning platform to house *All of Us* informational materials and trainings.

- **Goal 1:** Develop, launch, and/or maintain training courses for a wide variety of audiences, in cooperation with the *All of Us* Consortium Training (ACT) Board.
- **Goal 2:** Continue to provide leadership and strategic planning for *All of Us* participant engagement activities and *All of Us* awareness within public libraries, in partnership with the NNLM *All of Us* Community Engagement Network.
- **Goal 3:** Maintain and enhance the *All of Us* Training and Education Platform (TEP).

Key Accomplishments

Digital Health Literacy Modules

Partnership with Cochrane to adapt materials in English and Spanish, covering key digital literacy topics like interpreting health claims, information safety, creating a password, and avoiding scams.

Health Equity Modules

Partnership with Cochrane to develop materials in English and Spanish, covering the basics of health equity in micro-training modules.

Citizen Science

Partnership with SciStarter, Arizona State University and Cornerstones of Science to host Citizen Science Events, including a Spanish-language Summer Reading program

COVID-19 SPOTLIGHT

Due to COVID-19, the NNLM AoU Participant Engagement Team created and implemented a virtual engagement plan:

- **Objective 1:** Develop a national, evidence-based model for guiding virtual engagement activities for leverage by *All of Us* to inform future *All of Us* virtual engagement plans.
