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RESEARCH PROGRAM

All of Us Consortium Training Courses

The *All of Us* Training and Education Platform (TEP) hosts a variety of online, asynchronous courses that engage consortium members and staff in learning about their role with the *All of Us* Research Program.

General Training

Annual Consortium Member Training: the purpose of this training is to provide a thorough overview of the NIH *All of Us* Research Program and how your role can help us reach 1 million or more participants! The course covers four main topic areas, including an introduction to the program, outreach and engagement aspects of the Participant Journey, Accessing Data and the Core Protocol.



Community Partner Training: the purpose of this course is to provide information for the program's community partners. This includes an introduction to the *All of Us* Research Program, Health Provider Organizations (HPOs), director volunteers, and social media.

Core Values Training: the purpose of this training is to provide an introduction to the NIH *All of Us* Research Program and the Core Values that guide our path towards reaching 1 million or more participants!

Consent & Recontact Campaign: the purpose of this course is to provide guidance for Consortium staff around Beta, national and new consent, the recontact campaign, and other staff resources.

Participant Interactions Training

Mobile Engagement Assets Training: this course provides training for part-time staff working with the *All of Us* Journey Mobile Education and Enrollment Center. In addition to providing awareness and education, this exhibit gives visitors who join the program the opportunity to provide physical measurements and blood and urine samples onboard.





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AANHPI Engagement Training: the purpose of these four modules is to equip *All of Us* consortium members with culturally tailored and appropriate approaches to engaging Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander (AANHPI) individuals, part of the effort to increase AANHPI enrollment in the *All of Us* Research Program.

Sexual Gender Minority Cultural Competency and Humility Training: the purpose of this training is to ensure that sexual and gender minority (SGM) people who express interest in the *All of Us* Research Program have a welcoming and positive experience and are motivated to enroll and participate. This is achieved by (i) providing information about the history of SGM communities and health, (ii) providing recommendations for SGM-appropriate language and interactions, (iii), facilitating opportunities to practice typical encounters with SGM participants, and (iv) providing post-training resources for assistance.

Biospecimen Training

Annual Direct Volunteer Bio-sample Training: the purpose of this training is to provide a comprehensive overview of physical measurement and biospecimen collection for Direct Volunteers in the *All of Us* Research Program. The course aims to provide clear expectations for how all Trained Program Staff (TPS) members can play an important role in ensuring the highest-quality biospecimens and data are collected during the visit.



Biospecimen Collection for HPOs: the purpose of this training is to provide a comprehensive and interactive look into the biospecimen collection process for Health care Provider Organizations (HPOs) in the *All of Us* Research Program. The course aims to provide clear expectations for how all Trained Program Staff (TPS) members can play an important role in ensuring the highest-quality biospecimens are collected and processed for future research use.

Technology Training

HealthPro Administrator Training: this interactive presentation serves as onboarding training for local enrollment site HealthPro administrators. HealthPro administrators will learn about user and access management and security requirements.



Computer Assisted Telephone Interviewing: Computer Assisted Telephone Interviews (CATI) is a telephone surveying method where a trained interviewer follows a script to collect answers from participants. The goal of CATI is to increase levels of participation and retention for participants by providing the choice to allow survey completion over the phone. This tool may be of particular support to participants who do not have access to a digital device or internet access,



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participants who need or want help using technology, participants with disabilities, and those with personal preference for phone-based engagement. This training is required for program staff who will be conducting CATI sessions with participants using Program Management Toolkit.

Researcher Workbench

The Researcher Workbench platform and its suite of custom tools are available to approved researchers. The Researcher Workbench provides access to Registered Tier data. Its powerful tools support data analysis and collaboration. The workbench also provides integrated help and educational resources through the Workbench User Support Hub. The *All of Us* Training and Education Platform includes certification courses that validate access to the Researcher Workbench.



Responsible Conduct of Research: This training is for those interested in joining the *All of Us* research community. Going beyond the usual compliance training on ethics that consortium staff may have seen before, this training not only presents key concepts of research ethics and policies, but clarifies how *All of Us* applies these concepts as part of its goal to catalyze positive change in research.
