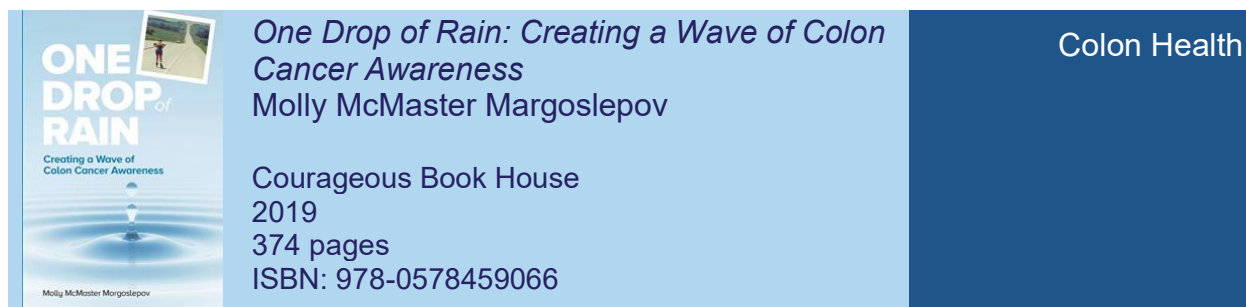


Discussion Guide



Summary
