Overview

The Health Sciences and Human Services Library (HSHSL) at the University of Maryland, Baltimore (UMB) serves as the Region 1 Regional Medical Library (RML). The office provides outreach, engagement, and education throughout DE, KY, MD, NJ, NC, PA, VA, WV, and DC.

Project Highlights

Bradbury-Sullivan LGBT Community Center:

"Promoting Flu Vaccines for LGBT Community Members in Pennsylvania"

The Bradbury-Sullivan LGBT Community Center partnered with the center's library and seven public libraries to increase health literacy about influenza vaccines and provide sites for vaccination, inoculating 274 LGBTQ+ community members.

OurSpace World: "Mirror Mirror Resources for Health, Food, and Environment: An Online Library for Black Youth and Families"

OurSpace World worked with public librarians to promote nutrition, health and food sovereignty in urban communities in Prince George's County, Maryland.

The Children's Home Society of New Jersey "Community Doula Training in Trenton, NJ"

Maternal Child Health staff conducted a prenatal education course for low-income, Black and Hispanic women, benefitting 90+ women & their infants.
