Summary

This project aimed to improve digital literacy in older adults, increase awareness of online health information resources, and create awareness of the *All of Us* Research Program (*All of Us*). The project team worked with a health sciences librarian to create a health resources toolkit to be downloaded onto tablets for participant use. The team brought these tablets to two area retirement homes and facilitated 10 events reaching 148 attendees. The sessions focused on topics relevant to the community, such as diabetes, chronic pain, cardiac disease, and mental health. Participants were trained to use the tablets to find health information from reliable sources such as MedlinePlus.gov, and the tablets were eventually given to activity participants.

Throughout the project, evaluations indicated attendees' growing comfort with using technology due to these sessions, as well as an understanding of where to find reliable health information online. After hearing about *All of Us*, several activity attendees were eager to learn more about participating in the program. The project also provided an opportunity for nursing students, who supported project activities, to get hands-on experience with aiding older adults in using technology. Students reflected on the value of supporting older adults in developing digital literacy skills in order to navigate digital health information.
