
Discussion Guide

- 6. How does the author's story intersect with other dimensions of his identity, such as ethnicity, gender, or socioeconomic background?
- 7. How does the memoir prompt readers to develop empathy and understanding for individuals who navigate multiple aspects of their identity?
- 8. How does the memoir shed light on the challenges and opportunities that Deaf individuals encounter within educational and societal contexts? What changes or improvements could be made to educational systems and society to better support Deaf individuals and other marginalized communities?
